New School Year: 20 Dr. Waite started the discussion by stating there are three topics to review. 21 22 The first topic discussed was the recent media reports of The Shoshone-Bannock Indian tribe 23 asking the Idaho State Board of Education to stop all public schools from using Native American mascots. Dr. Waite reported the main issue is with names of mascots that are insensitive to the 24 Native American culture. The administration and athletic department have discussed the issue 25 and believe it is a community and local decision; while the school mascot "The Indians" is not 26 offensive in name or visually, the District does need to have a better answer then "we are not 27 28 trying to offend anyone". 29 The second topic discussed was regarding the August 27th bond election. Dr. Waite prepared a 30 31 fact sheet that included the following information: 32 Amount requested is \$6,830,000. 33 The increased bond amount is due to rising constructions costs. Constructions costs in 34 Magic Valley have increased 5.12% per year. These construction numbers are based on 35 real numbers from Design West and Starr Cooperation. 36 • The cost to taxpayers would be \$1.56 per thousand dollars of assessed value. The estimated cost for a \$100,000 home would be approximately \$6.50 a month or 21 cents a 37 38 39 The State Bond Equalization reimbursement is estimated to be \$1,984,565. The building plans emphasis is on safety, security, education, efficiency, vocational 40

 The building plans emphasis is on safety, security, education, efficiency, vocational expansions, multipurpose building, security updates, additional classrooms and additional spaces.

The "Say Yes to Shoshone" committee met on August 12, 2019 to start promotion plans and get the word out about the election. 1 the need becomes a major necessity. Dr. Waite reported the committee will be sending out 2 facts and reminder cards without using District funds. 3 4 The final topic was called "Relationships". The Board and audience watched a video by 5 Dwayne Johnson recalling his choices as a young teen and how a coach/teacher mentored

him for the future. Dr. Waite, administration, and some of the staff recently attended a

restorative training and the message was relationships do matter, there are four types of
