The District's Consolidated Plan has been approved by the Department of Education. 36 The plan affects title, special education programs, and reimbursements have been 37 requested. 38 b. District General funds 100.616310 and 100.616320 are related to the special education 39 expenditures (Medicaid billing) and the expense of the Medicaid Match. In the past, 40 these expenses were recorded in the Federal Special Education Funding. Per the 41 Department of Education those expenses now are to be recorded in the general fund. 42 These two accounts were not included in the budget therefore this will create a 43 negative balance. 44 c. The general fund revenues and expenses are as expected for this time of year. 45 46 Chair Bozzuto stated if there was no further discussion, it was so moved and seconded to approve 47 the accounts payables and financial statements as presented and asked for Trustees' voice vote.
