High School Graduation Requirements

The Board shall award a regular high school diploma to every student enrolled in the District who meets the requirements of graduation established by the State Board of Education, and additional local requirements articulated in the student handbook. The official transcript will indicate the specific courses taken and level of achievement.

The Board shall establish graduation requirements which, as a minimum, satisfy those established by the Board of Public Education (IDAPA 08.02.03.107). Those requirements will be published in the school's student handbook.

Effective with the graduating class of 2006, all students will show proficiency on the Idaho Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) as defined by State Board rules in order to graduate. (IDAPA 08.02.03.105.02). An "eligible" student who does not attain at least a proficient score prior to graduation may appeal to this Board for relief from the ISAT proficiency requirement. For definition of student eligibility and appeal procedure, see Administrative Procedure 2700P. At the discretion of the local school board, said student may be given an opportunity to demonstrate proficiency of the achievement standard through the "Secondary Route to Graduation" outlined at Policy 2715.

A student who possesses a disabling condition shall satisfy those competency requirements which are incorporated into the individualized education program ("IEP"). Satisfactory completion of the objectives incorporated into the IEP shall serve as the basis for determining completion of a course.

A student may be denied participation in graduation ceremonies. Such exclusion shall be regarded as a school suspension. In such instances, the diploma will be awarded after the official ceremony has been held.
